

Tussey Mountainback Race Weather

In the Tussey Mountain area during the first half of October, the weather can be quite variable. Normal high temperatures are in the lower to middle 60s and normal low temperatures are in the lower to middle 40s. However, all of the record high temperatures during that period are in the 80s and all of the record low temperatures during that period are in the 20s. Measurable rainfall only occurs on an average of one or two days per week during that time of the year. Around 1/3 of the days are sunny and about 1/2 of the days are cloudy or mostly cloudy.

During the first half of October 2003 and 2004, the temperature never fell below the freezing point and less than 1.00 inch of rain fell. The highest temperature during the first half of October 2003 was 74 degrees and the highest temperature during the first half of October 2004 was 72 degrees.

More than 3.00 inches of rain fell during the first half of October 2002. During that period, the temperature rose as high as 79 degrees and the lowest temperature was 35 degrees.

There was some very chilly weather during the first half of October 2001. Three days had a low temperature below the freezing point. The highest temperature was 78 degrees. Measurable rain only fell on 2 of the first 15 days of the month. The total rainfall for the period was less than 1.00 inch.

Approximately 1.50 inches of rain fell in the Tussey Mountain area during the first half of October 2000. Daily high temperatures ranged from the middle 40s to the upper 70s and early morning low temperatures ranged from the middle 30s to the middle 50s.
